# Annual ORW World and U.S. Rankings

It's that time again and here are the 24th Annual ORW World Rankings at 20 and 50 Km, the 22nd Annual U.S. Rankings at the same distances, and the 16th Annual Women's 10 Km Rankings, both World and U.S. The women's rankings lag by a few years not because of any sexist attitude on our part, but because there just wasn't enough significant activity, at least that came to our attention, to justify them earlier.

As usual, these rankings are a subjective judgment on the part of your editor based on performance at the particular distance throughout the year. We take into account performance in major competitions, times, and wins and losses versus other athletes. The rankings are accompanied by lists of the best times at each distance for the year



Rohl, although beaten by Vaill in the National title race, gets the top slot off her American record in the Goodwill Games and other fast time. . . Third and fourth are pretty clear cut. Yarbrough and Herazo split in four races against each other, but Dana was ahead in both the National title race and the Olympic Festival. Herazo had very fast 10 Km splits in three longer races (46:42 and 47:52 in 1 Hour races and 47:23 in a 15 Km), but we are looking just at 10 Km races here. . . Eighth, ninth , and tenth are very close. Richards-Kerr has an argument for the eighth slot, having beaten the other two at the Nationals, but Dee Walker beat her in four of five other head-to-head races and Rellinger both other times they went head to head.

The Chinese are difficult to rank since they never raced outside of Asia, but the slots we have assigned them seem fair. Perez has no fast time, but had two very competitive races against Segura and Garcia.

Chylinski lost to no U.S. walkers other than these two and is an easy pick for third. The other spots are less clear and required a bit of subjective thought, but I'm happy with the choices. Whatley, coming back from injury all season finally had it together at the Alongi race and gets the nod for the final spot over Gary Morgan and Herm Nelson, eighth and ninth at the National title race. Morgan really struggled at the Olympic Festival and Whatley beat him there as well as at Alongi, and Nelson had only the one race at 20 Km.

## LOOKING BACK

25 Years Ago (From the Dec. 1969 ORW)-- The ORW made a Man of the Decade Award to Charlie Silcock, who did so much to promote the sport in those years, and a Walker of the Decade Award to Ron Laird. Ron Zinn, Rudy Haluza, and Larry Young ranked behind Laird for the latter award. . .Goetz Klopfer did 20 Km in 1:32:24 on a San Francisco track.

20 Years Ago (from the Dec. 1974 ORW)--Jack Boitano, the National Racewalk Chairman at that time, won the Coney Island 10 Mile Handicap in 1:34:43. Fast time honors went to Ron Laird with a 1:13:29. . . Laird also scored a 1500 meter/2 Mile double at an indoor meet in Pittsburgh with a 6:06.7 and 14:05. . . Included in this issue were some interesting excerpts from a 1910 book on racewalking by Hugh Innes.

15 Years Ago (From the Dec. 1979 ORW)--Mexico's Daniel Bautista, winner of the World Cup in a blazing 1:18:49 and with a world record of 1:20:07 on the track, led the ORW World 20 Km rankings. His teammate Domingo Colin was second, ahead of three Soviets. Mexicans Raul Gonzales, Martin Bermudez, and Enrique Vera were ranked 1-2-3 in the 50. Gonzales faded to fourth in the World Cup after building a huge lead with what proved to be a killing pace, but had a World Record 3:41:39 on the track. Great Britain's Marian Fawkes was ranked number one in the Women's 10 Km. Leading the U.S. rankings were Neal Pyke (20 Km), Marco Evoniuk (50 Km), and Susan Liers (10 Km). . . Canada's Marcel Jobin led the National 25 Km race in Las Vegas with a 1:52:27, with Jim Heiring claiming the national title in second (1:57:28). Marco Evoniuk, Ray Sharp, Dennis Reilly, and Tom Dooley followed. . . Jobin also won the National 35 Km in Houston, his 2:37:16 leaving John Knifton better than 18 minutes back. Dooley and BIII Ranney were next. . . Chris Hansen stormed through 10 Km in 43:06 in Seattle with Steve DiBernardo second in 44:29. . . In Kiev, Soviet Nikolai Udovenko bettered the listed World 30 Km record with a 2:08:16 on the track, but was short of Jose Marin's 2:08:00 earlier in the year.

10 Years Ago (From the Dec. 1984 ORW)--Leading the World Rankings for that year were Mexico's Ernesto Canto (20 Km, the GDR's Ronald Weigel (50 KM), and Olga Kristop, USSR (10 Km). Top ranked in the U.S. were Marco Evoniuk (20 Km), Carl Schueler (50 Km), and Ester Lopez (10 KM). . .The issue included a report by Dr. Howard Palamarchuk on TAC's first Racewalk Sports Medicine Science Seminar.

**5 Years Ago** (from the Dec. 1989 ORW)--Kerry Saxby, Australia; Ileana Salvador, Italy; and Beate Anders, GDR were 1-2-3 in the ORW World 10 Km Rankings. Lynn Weik, Teresa Vaill, and Debbi Lawrence topped the U.S. rankings. In the World 20 Km rankings, it was Frants Kostyukevitch, Yevgeniy Misyula, and Mikhail Schennikov, all USSR. In the U.S., Tim Lewis, Gary Morgan, and Mark Manning were on top. At 50 Km, we ranked Simon

Baker, Australia; Andrei Perlov, USSR; and Stanislav Vezhel, USSR as the top three in the World, and Paul Wick, HErm Nelson, and Tim Lewis as the top three in the U.S. . . . Mexico's Carlos Mercenario blistered the New York City Marathon in 3:11:56, beating the UK's Chris Maddocks by nearly 2 minutes and this year's winner, Bo Gustaffson, by 6 1/2 minutes. Perlov was fourth in a star-studded field.

### Standards

The reason for standards is to limit the size of a field to a managable number of athletes. For the indoor meet we look for 12-15 walkers, while the outdoor races can handle 20-24. Indoor standards for 1995 remain the same as last year

### 1996 Olympic Trials

After much discussion and review of figures from the past 3 years, the following standards were recommended:

Women's 10 kilometers	49:45
Men's 20 kilometers	1:30:00
Men's 50 kilometers	4:25:00 automatic, or top 15 performers

1996 will be the first Olympic Games which will have qualifying standards in all events, similar to the World Championships. Countries may enter one athlete at the B standard. To enter 2 or 3, all competitors must have achieved the A standard.

Men's 20 k	A: 1:23:30	B: 1:26:00
Men's 50 k	A: 4:00:00	B: 4:05:00

The arguements on the 50K standards brought up several philosophical questions: Do setting tougher standards makes athletes train harder? Does softening the standard necessarily indicate failure (especially when 4:40+ got into the race in 1992). And are standards set on what "could be".
